We can also help uninsured clients who may qualify for Medicaid or low cost Kentucky health insurance by directing them to KYNECT Connectors and in-person assisters. Connectors will be able to help qualified clients sign up for health insurance, including Medicaid.

Kentucky residents who need transportation for cancer screenings or cancer-related appointments can contact us for help with transportation assistance. Amount of assistance varies with monthly funding available.


Proceeds benefitted the Kentucky Pink Connection. It was beautiful day for riding, walking, and pumpkin painting.

Walk for Warmth and Health

On February 22, on a beautiful Saturday morning, Kentucky Pink Connection (KPC), along with over 200 people, met at Triangle Park in Lexington to support the Lexington Rescue Mission's "Walk for Warmth." KPC also distributed printed material on the doors of neighborhood homes and apartments as part of the KPC "Count Me In" Program.

The program encourages Fayette County residents with no health insurance to contact KPC to determine if they were qualified for no-charge breast and colon cancer screenings.

With the help of volunteers and interns, we work with other organizations to educate underinsured Kentuckians on programs available for cancer screenings.

Planned additional groups include the Colors of Promise, an African-American community outreach program, and Ties That Bind (Lazos Que Perduran), a Spanish-speaking outreach program, in the Lexington area.

"Yes, Mamm!" Program
